Atlantic District of The Wesleyan Church Standing Rules

A. Principles

- 1. The ministers and laypersons of the Atlantic District are and shall continue to be committed to holy living and heart purity. Only those actions and attitudes that speak the mind of Christ should be evidenced among us.
- 2. The ministers and lay persons of the Atlantic District are and shall continue to be committed to a spirit of unity and brotherhood that, in the spirit of Christ, transcends the consideration of personal bias based on history, geography, or tradition.
- 3. The ministers and lay persons of the Atlantic District are and shall continue to be committed to Kingdom building through evangelism and discipleship. Our program and budgets shall reflect our high priority to winning the lost and discipling new converts.

B. District Conference Matters

For a more complete overview of the duties and powers of the district conference, please see paragraphs 1075-1180 in the 2012 Discipline of The Wesleyan Church.

- 1. The Atlantic District fiscal year shall be from May 1 to April 30.
- 2. Local churches are encouraged to give reasonable financial assistance to their delegates and pastor when representing them at annual conference sessions.
- 3. District Board of Administration Members-at-Large Election

The District Board of Administration shall consist of twelve members, namely, the District Superintendent, the Assistant District Superintendent, the District Secretary, the District Treasurer and eight (8) membersat-large. In electing members-at-large, while being free to vote for any nominee, the conference delegates shall be requested to consider election so as to provide for provincial/state representation and lay/clergy parity according to the following formula which reflects our relative strength within each geographic entity.

Maine	1 lay and 1 clergy
New Brunswick	2 lay and 2 clergy
Nova Scotia/Newfoundland & Labrador/Prince Edward Island	1 lay and 1 clergy

4. District Board of Administration Staggered Terms for Members-At-Large

All members at large shall be elected for three-year terms. Members may succeed themselves at the conclusion of a three-year term if nominated and elected. Should a vacancy occur during any three-year term, such vacancy shall be filled by the DBA in accordance with existing Discipline provisions.

5. District Nominating Committee

The District Nominating Committee shall consist of seven (7) persons, namely the District Superintendent and 6 other members. In order to provide valuable and necessary input from each region of the district, it is recommended that the members be elected according to the following formula.

Maine	1 lay and 1 clergy
New Brunswick	1 lay and 1 clergy
Nova Scotia/Newfoundland & Labrador/Prince Edward Island	1 lay and 1 clergy

6. Camp Board

The Camp Board shall consist of up to nine persons with the District Superintendent as Chair and the District WY President as an honorary member, and up to eight members at large. The District Board of Administration shall elect annually two members, one minister and one lay person, to terms of four years

each. The Beulah Camp Caretaker and Caton's Island Director shall serve as resource persons to the board and shall report to each session as requested.

7. Officer and Department Head Elections

The District Conference shall elect only those officers and boards as required by the Discipline or the District with the District Board of Administration authorized to fill all other positions. (The District Conference will elect the District Superintendent, District Secretary, District Treasurer, District Board of Administration Members-at-Large, Nominating Committee, and General Conference delegates.)

- 8. The annual direct district support for Beulah/Caton's/Riverside shall be set at 10% of the actual receipts of the district portion of the USF.
- 9. The annual direct district support for Evangelism and Church Growth shall be set at 15% of the actual receipts of the district portion of the USF.

C. District Ministerial Matters

- 1. All ministers of the Atlantic District are expected to attend the District Conference, the Ordination Service, and the annual Ministerial Convention. Satisfactory reason for any absence shall be provided to the District Superintendent.
- 2. All ministers are expected to support the district camping program and to share in the work of the camp(s) as assigned.
- 3. Each pastor when leaving a church, will provide for the incoming pastor a data base/information packet containing information as full and complete as possible on the pastoral charge.

D. Local Church and Pastoral Matters

For a more complete overview of pastoral responsibilities and local board of administration duties, please see paragraphs 750-782 in the 2012 Discipline of The Wesleyan Church.

- 1. Pastoral recall votes shall be conducted during the first two weeks of March. The meeting for an initial pastoral call will routinely be conducted anytime after the middle of March. Any pastor wishing to announce a resignation prior to March 1 may do so only after receiving the approval of the District Superintendent.
- 2. The tenure of an outgoing pastor shall end on the second Sunday in July and the pastoral change shall routinely take place on the following Monday.
- 3. Churches calling a new pastor shall pay moving expenses and related costs such as immigration expenses and travel.
- 4. Each pastor shall be entitled to a minimum vacation per year with pay in accordance with years of service in the ministry according to the following formula:

1 - 5 years service	-	14 days not to exceed 2 Sundays
6 - 10 years service	-	21 days not to exceed 3 Sundays

-

- 11+ years of service
- 28 days not to exceed 4 Sundays

Any year of service for which a pastor is entitled to vacation is calculated from the anniversary date of the first Sunday of employment. Vacation time is fully earned upon completion of each year of service. If a pastor leaves a church prior to the anniversary date, vacation will be given on a pro-rata basis. When a pastor leaves a church at the customary time of pastoral change, the church he/she has been serving is responsible for vacation time for that conference year. No church should at any time be expected to provide vacation time in the same year for both an outgoing and incoming pastor.

5. Up to two weeks including two Sundays per year are available to any pastor to serve as a special worker in revivals or special meetings. Any speaking/singing engagements beyond the two weeks require prior approval of the local board of administration.

- 6. Pastors should inform the vice-chair of the local board of administration of any plans to be absent from the pastoral charge for more than three consecutive days.
- 7. Sabbatical Leave:
 - a. A sabbatical leave, with pay, of up to 30 consecutive days not to include more than four Sundays, and in addition to regular vacation is available to any solo or senior pastor after completing seven years of ministry or any multiple thereof in the current place of appointment.
 - b. The specific timing of the sabbatical leave must be mutually agreed upon between the pastor and the LBA in consultation with the District Superintendent.
 - c. The church is responsible for any cost incurred in filling the pulpit during the sabbatical leave.
 - d. The pastor is responsible to spend a significant portion of the sabbatical leave involved in a learning experience either formal or informal. The details of the learning experience component of the sabbatical leave are to be provided by the pastor to the LBA and District Superintendent when the dates of the sabbatical leave are being set.
 - e. The pastor is responsible to file a report of the learning experience component of the sabbatical leave with the LBA and District Superintendent upon completion of said leave.
 - f. If the learning experience component is in a formal setting, the LBA is requested to give consideration to assisting the pastor in the cost of attending such.
 - g. If the learning experience component is an informal one to be pursued in a retreat setting, the Atlantic District will make accommodations at Beulah Camp available at no cost to the pastor during the sabbatical leave, subject to prior bookings. In the summer months, this could include the Evangelists Cottage, and year round in the Hotel or Heritage Hall.
 - h. The LBA of any church having long-term staff pastors are encouraged to consider a sabbatical leave for such staff pastors in harmony with the general provisions of this resolution.

All Annual Service Reports have been reviewed with deficiencies noted for pending action.

District Superintendent Emeritus Report:

Dr. H. C. Wilson presented a yearly report to the Conference that underlined several positive and challenging points from the District Year 2013-14. The report also reviewed the progress of **"The Seven"** (seven short-term objectives from the District Year 2013-14).

Dr. Wilson expressed support and appreciation for Rev. David LeRoy's service as the Atlantic District Superintendent and extended a moment of personal privilege to Rev. LeRoy in addressing the District Conference.

Rev. LeRoy offered a brief update on his present health journey and thanked the District for its support and prayers.

The Conference delegates responded with a round of applause expressing appreciation to Rev. David LeRoy and his service to the Atlantic District.

Dr. Wilson's report was accepted.

Assistant District Superintendent's Report:

Rev. Tim Guptill, Assistant District Superintendent, presented a brief report as Assistant District Superintendent. (The full report is included in the 2014 District Journal)

The report was accepted.

District Treasurer's Report:

Lic. Kathy Shanks, District Treasurer, presented the Annual District Treasurer's Report highlighting six specific items from the financial overview page: Operating Fund, Evangelism & Church Planting, Beulah Camp, Caton's Island, Wesleyan Place & Revolving Fund. The overview provided Conference Delegates with a snapshot of the District's financial position at the end of the Fiscal Year 2014. The report was submitted for the information of the Conference.

(The District Treasurer's Full Report is included in the 2014 District Journal)

Election of District Superintendent:

Dr. Jo Anne Lyon presented the nomination of Dr. H. C. Wilson for election as District Superintendent of the Atlantic District to a four year term. It was unanimously supported and recommended by the District Board of Administration on February 12, 2014. Dr. Lyon immediately called for the election by ballot with a yes/no reply. The Conference cast 225 ballots with 113 needed for election. **Dr. Wilson was elected** with 223 ballots.

Proposed District Structure Going Forward:

Dr. Wilson proposed the following structure to the 126th Conference body and having been previously approved by the DBA:

The unexpected change in District leadership brought about by the serious diagnosis of David LeRoy has ultimately resulted in a modified leadership model being recommended to the District Conference going forward.

Daily Proceedings

The basic ingredients in the recommendation are:

- 1. The DBA, working with the General Superintendent, has unanimously nominated Dr. H. C. Wilson to a four-year term as District Superintendent. This nomination will be voted on during the proceedings.
- 2. Dr. Wilson has also been serving as Chair of The Wesleyan Church of Canada (TWCC), a position that will demand increased focus in this next season as the matter of an Established National Conference in Canada continues to develop.
- 3. The proposal is that Dr. Wilson serve as District Superintendent of our District having full authority and responsibility but only serving 75% of the time. The remaining 25% of his time will be given to TWCC. It is recognized that these time segments are approximate and will fluctuate from one month to the next, but the 75-25 split is the targeted objective.
- 4. Dr. Wilson's salary and benefits will be split between the District and TWCC on the 75-25 basis.
- 5. A full time Assistant District Superintendent position is proposed which will both broaden overall District level ministry and allow for the 75-25 split mentioned above to be initiated without negative impact on the District.
- 6. The funding of the revamped District administrative piece is partially accomplished by the shared support of the DS thus reducing the direct cost to the District; the elimination of a part-time position in the District office; the transfer of camping responsibilities to the ADS which makes the salary dollars of the Executive Director of Camping available and a mortgage consolidation that resulted in a rate reduction and a decrease of some \$2400 per month in payment.

Following some brief discussion and explanation the Conference accepted the proposal without dissenting vote.

Full Time Assistant District Superintendent Recommendation:

Dr. Wilson proposed the following document for Conference approval, which was previously approved by the DBA.

Whereas the growth and development of The Atlantic District and the breadth of ministry and administrative responsibilities of the District Superintendent have frequently raised the question of when a second officer would be employed to share the ministry load, and

Whereas the potential for increased effectiveness and efficiency of our overall District operation, vision casting and mission fulfillment would be significantly enhanced by the addition of a second leader, and, Whereas the District has given evidence to its capacity to fund two positions by having supported both Rev. LeRoy and Dr. Wilson for the majority of the past fiscal year, and

Whereas the emerging role of The Wesleyan Church of Canada is moving forward and will continue to draw, in a controlled and limited manner, on the time and energy of the Atlantic District Superintendent, and

Whereas Discipline 1327 provides for a District Conference to choose to have a full-time Assistant District Superintendent,

Resolved that the Assistant District Superintendent position in The Atlantic District become a full-time position effective immediately and that the position be filled by the DBA upon the recommendation of the District Superintendent in accordance with the provision of the current Discipline. The vote was unanimously passed by vote acclamation.

Staggered Terms for DBA Members:

Dr. Wilson submitted for Conference approval an amendment to the Atlantic District Standing Rule concerning election terms for District Board of Administration Members-at-Large. The amendment was approved by the DBA on July 7, 2014.

Whereas the stability of any group is well served by terms of office exceeding one year thus providing for a measure of continuity and

Whereas all terms on our District Board of Administration are one-year terms except for the District Superintendent and

Whereas the introduction of a DBA term rotation arrangement would strengthen the board, Resolved that the members-at-large of the DBA serve for terms of three years after which any member could continue to serve subject to nomination and election and

Resolved that this arrangement become effective immediately as follows:

Members from NB to be elected in 2014 to three year terms to expire in 2017 Members from NS/PEI/NL to be elected in 2014 to two year terms to expire in 2016 Members from ME to be elected in 2014 to one year terms to expire in 2015

The vote was unanimously passed by vote acclamation.

The Conference recessed in preparation for the morning service at 10:30 am

Second Business Session July 10, 2014 @ 1:30 pm

The District Conference reconvened at 1:40 P.M. with a call to order from Dr. H. C. Wilson. Dr. Wilson invited Rev. Peter Moore to the platform welcoming and introducing Rev. Moore as the first full-time Assistant District Superintendent of the Atlantic District. Rev. Moore was granted a few moments to address the Conference.

Also, special recognition was given to Rev. Nick Graham for his good work in Maple Ridge, NB despite having severe physical challenges. Rev. Pete Thomas offered prayer for Rev. Graham and family.

Election of District Board Members:

Dr. Wilson presented the 2014 Nominating Committee Report. The report highlighted the process of nominating delegates to the District Conference ballot. Also, a brief biography was offered for each lay delegate on the 2014 ballot.

Dr. Wilson informed delegates that a voice acclamation would be entertained whenever the Conference encountered one name for an elected position and providing there were no further nominations from the floor. The Chair also noted that the positions of District Secretary and District Treasurer do require a ballot vote, even when faced with a sole nominee.

Atlantic District Superintendent Emeritus Report - 2014

I am writing this the morning after the surreal and shattering happenings here in Moncton in the last two days. Five RCMP officers shot, three fatally. A city-wide lock down. Schools closed. Banks closed. Government offices closed. Buses taken off the streets. Police barricades that kept us from the district office. Armoured vehicles manned by SWAT teams patrolling the streets. Grandchildren in the lock down area. The Commanding Officer of the RCMP in New Brunswick choking back tears as he spoke with the media about the loss of their officers. I was reminded of the verse in Proverbs that makes the obvious point that "you do not know what a day may bring forth."

In recent times, these types of events are all too often part of the routine of the life and death cycle in places like Bangkok, Cairo, Aleppo, Jos, Caracas, Kabul, Bagdad, the Crimea and eastern Ukraine to name just a few. The world is a desperate and troubled place, but God has entrusted us with a balanced message for these times, a message of grace and truth, hope and holy living.

For the year under review, I firmly believe that a deep commitment to the balanced message of grace and truth, hope and holy living has been the unshakeable foundation of our ministry. There are the tempting rabbit trails of old patterns and odd preferences that beckon but, by and large, are resisted in favour of the balanced message. Conversely there is the magnetic pull of constant change and crass consumerism that, by and large, are resisted in favour of the balanced message. Grace and truth, hope and holy living - that is and must remain our mantra.

Early in the 2014 church year, in May of last year, I was asked to serve as your Interim District Superintendent for eight months through January of this year. In September, I was asked to extend my interim leadership role for an additional six months through July of this year.

During these recent months I was ultimately asked if I would consider a nomination for the DS position for a four year term, to which I agreed. That matter will be voted on by this conference this morning.

All of this impacts the nature of this report. Normally, the DS report looks back to the year ended and stretches forward to the year to come and beyond. With the uncertainty of the future view as the DBA diligently worked through the DS nomination process, and not wanting to appear overly presumptuous concerning the upcoming vote, it seemed prudent and appropriate to focus this report primarily on the year past. The future excitement will leak into these moments but will be front and centre on Sunday afternoon.

All things being equal (whatever that actually means), the Sunday afternoon wrap up service this week will Celebrate Tomorrow. It promises to be a dynamic hour together as we unpack several ministry thrusts and renewed vision going forward. Don't miss it. With the Master's help, it will send us out like the young soldier in the American Civil War who, when asked by an officer why he was running toward the enemy lines, replied, "Golly, Captain, I'm running 'cause I can't fly."

And so this morning, we will glance back over our collective shoulders at a year that has now marched into history and where no changes are now possible. What has happened, has happened.

And on Sunday afternoon we anticipate looking over our collective horizon at a future story yet to be written - where history will be made, ministry will occur and a balanced message of grace and truth, hope and holy living will be proclaimed. What will happen - well, we will have to wait and see.

Like any year under review, this one just passed contained the starkly contrasting experiences that are the stuff of life. The swinging pendulum of circumstances and the unpacking of Providence brought with them high points of celebration and gain along with low points of separation and loss.

Separation and Loss

Services were discontinued at Shelburne Hope this year when it simply became apparent that the declining work could not continue. This type of necessity is always a difficult step to take especially for the faithful core who have stood by the stuff over the years. We did retain the buildings there and, who knows, with the Master's help, a relaunched work may emerge there, perhaps even in a different format.

Mrs. Elsie Morgan, who served for more than 30 years as a missionary in South Africa alongside her husband Bill, passed away this spring. She laboured faithfully and effectively in her demanding support role in South Africa long before the days of digital communication, word processors, computers and the many other conveniences of our day. Well done Elsie.

Mrs. Debbie Rideout, wife of Pastor Jasper Rideout from North Head, lost her battle with cancer but gained a home in heaven in exchange. Debbie was an enthusiastic follower of Christ, a consistent support to Jasper in ministry and a wonderful "mom" to Sammy. Thanks Debbie.

Mrs. Avis Hicks who served faithfully with her husband Rev. Bertram Hicks across a life-time of ministry went home to be with the Lord this year. She and her husband raised a family that loves God and serves the church in various ways. Her pleasant countenance, gentle spirit and solid walk of faith will be missed

Rev. Conard Symonds, co-pastor of Crosspoint Church in Fredericton, went on home in December after a relatively brief battle with cancer. We had been friends for more than 50 years and his loss was felt deeply both from a ministry and a personal perspective. His funeral was a one-of-a-kind experience and ended with Mama Tried, a song by Merle Haggard, his favourite country singer. Old friend, I'll see you at the house.

There was a statistical loss of sufficient magnitude as to warrant mention. The primary worship attendance at Moncton posted a loss of some 570, a 30% decline from last year. While the actual Sunday AM worship service attendance remained essentially level, the method in which numbers were calculated and reported underwent an adjustment with the discontinuation of the Living Christmas Tree being the most significant single factor in this adjustment. From here on, it is onward and upward building on this revised base.

Celebration and Gain

Multi site churches began during the year - that is, one church meeting in more than one location. Kings Valley, which owns a building went multi site by renting a theatre in East Saint John and KVEast was born. Deep Water which has been renting a theatre since its launch bought a building and Deep Water North Street was born. Hillside, which owns a building, is now completing the purchase of another church and is going multi site.

Three different models. All multi site. All deliberately launched to broaden ministry opportunity and impact. This is only the beginning of this Great Commission push - keep watching. More word on Sunday afternoon.

Our initial Maximizing Impact weekend was held during the year. This involves early meeting with the LBA by the DS as the purpose and process is explained and buy-in requested. An extensive self study is completed by the church prior to the on site MI weekend. The actual weekend involves interviews with pastoral staff, individual interviews with LBA members, group interaction sessions, leadership training session and facility overview. The outcome of the weekend is a report featuring items to be commended, items of concern and recommendations related to the identified concerns.

Corbett Ave was our pilot church and Pastor AJ and the LBA were truly on board. Other churches will be involved this year. This is only the beginning of this Great Commission push - keep watching. The outcomes to date at Corbett are very positive and there has been an amazing development relative to the little green house - well, be here Sunday afternoon for the rest of the story.

Some specific points of celebration and gain include:

- Moncton baptized 112 in a single day a record for our district.
- Havelock, NS dedicated a beautiful and functional new church.
- Deep Water purchased, refurbished and dedicated the North Street property and returned the church to its original purpose redeemed the church actually.
- Our attendance on Easter topped 17,000 our largest district wide attendance ever.
- Dartmouth Hillside is completing the purchase of the former Forest Hills United Church of Canada.
- Jon and Erin Stephens, Mike and Kristie Tapper, Andrew and Tammie Phillips, Caleb and Jerusha Richardson, Del and Melissa Hiney, Jedie Elliott, Shawn and Michelle Craven, and Peter and Ellen Moore joining our ranks since last conference are excellent additions that strengthen and deepen our tribe.
- Charles and Ruby Bain along with Tim Long served this year at Havelock, NS with great passion and God-given wisdom. We are truly indebted to them for their outstanding service to the Cause in this year of difficult transition at Havelock. Allan Mullen and Floyd Peters have served on the Advisory

Committee during this season and have done so with character, common sense and class.

- With the exclusion of the Moncton situation, the district primary service attendance overall increased modestly again last year with Kings Valley leading the way. Twenty six of our churches reported an attendance increase we can do better.
- The statistical overview will appropriately highlight numerical gains once again. In addition, I want to highlight some significant percentage gains in worship attendance as well. Topping that list is Fort Fairfield that increased by 37% after nearly closing a year ago. Others in the 20% or higher increase include Head of Millstream, Norton, Crystal and Ingomar Faith. Our hats are off to these smaller churches and their pastors. Progress in their Jerusalem onward and upward.
- Our larger churches continue to experience an overall forward momentum with the 12 churches above 200 in average attendance accounting for more than 61% of our morning attendance. Our top 3 churches account for 32%. When the churches in the 100 range are added to that mix it reveals that more than 80% of our attendance is clustered in 25 churches. Progress in their Jerusalem onward and upward.
- Thirty seven of our churches baptized new converts and forty two-churches reported people coming to Christ.
- New milestones were registered in the million dollar threshold USF collection topped 1 million (we missed it last year by 158) ; Beulah and Catons total income topped 1 million (for the first time); total missions and benevolence giving increased by 75 thousand and topped 1 million (also for the first time.)

The Seven

Last year in my report I outlined short-term objectives for the year just ended. By way of accountability, I want to report to you on The Seven.

- 1. Zone pastoral gatherings will be conducted. This occurred with very strong and positive response and excellent participation. Every pastor except one either was present or provided prior notice as to why they would not be present. Incredible. A few of our pastors actually drove hours to attend a meeting in a zone other than their own due to schedule conflicts. What tribal spirit.
- 2. One day pastoral prayer and soul care retreats will occur. This did not take place but is on the go forward radar.
- 3. Long term church planting strategy will be crafted and short term church revitalization will be ignited. Both happened or are in ongoing process. The relaunch of Bangor Pathway and the strategic thrust into Newfoundland both testify to the planting matter. Hats off to Stuart Marples and the Solid Rock crew for such excellent passion and ground work. The Maximizing Impact weekend at Corbett went further faster than first anticipated. AJ Plaizier and the LBA were and are a joy to work with. We are on the move.
- 4. It was predicted that meaningful interaction with the global church would come into sharper focus. This year, short term mission teams from 25 of our churches went to various mission fields - more churches to more places than ever before. You will hear in the service later this morning about opportunities for next year. On Sunday afternoon, there will be a strong representative group from last year's teams that will be easy to identify in the crowd.
- 5. Enhanced communication through various media will continue and improve. Our primary communication piece, It's Monday Again has flourished this year. Our number of subscribers has increased by some 40% without any promo other than word of mouth. Our weekly open rate hovers around 75%, far above the industry average for this type of contact piece. The quality improved greatly this year with the addition of pictures and graphics. If you are not receiving IMA, sign up instructions are in your packet.
- 6. Partial or full funding of the Leadership Summit and other training events will occur. The district did partially fund our ministers in attending the Leadership Summit and many did so. I attended in two locations so I could rub shoulders with the tribe. We also sponsored techie days and shared in other events as well.
- 7. Dialog on the purpose and program of Beulah Camp did and is taking place. Schedule and program changes are in place for this year as we seek to maximize the impact of this incredible place. There is more work to do to be sure, but we are focused on the horizon before us.

For the most part, with The Seven, we did what we said we would do and we finished what we started.

Deep Appreciation

These reports are expected to provide the perfunctory expression of appreciation to various persons who dotted the district landscape during the year. My list is far from perfunctory and at best is limited since there are so many who helped in so many ways and supported with so many expressions of affirmation. However, at the recognized risk of missing some who should be included, I must express deep appreciation to:

- our GS Dr. Lyon who guided our district through the waters of DS transition and always displayed such genuine interest in the welfare and health of the district.
- our DBA that wrestled through this very unusual year with its extra meetings and responsibility and did so with integrity and character.
- the ministerial tribe that has been so incredibly affirming and supportive very humbling really.
- Karrilee whose dedicated and high quality second-mile work ethic is such a blessing to all of us.
- Rob Trafton, Bruce and Roxie Cheney, Dean Stephenson and the Beulah/Catons staff and volunteers whose passionate involvement make our camping ministry truly top notch.
- my wife Gloria who started the adventure of marriage with me in 1965 and whose value across these decades is beyond measure.
- the Master to whom all praise is due for any good that was or will be accomplished.
- David and Joanne LeRoy who have faced life-altering challenges and changes and have done so with grace and dignity.

Special Mention

When the 2014 church year began in May of 2013, David LeRoy was serving in his sixth year as your District Superintendent. Very early in the year he was placed on an eight month medical leave with a continuation of full salary and benefits. In September it was concluded that he would not be able to return to the DS assignment.

When the eight month leave was completed in January of this year, David concluded his term as Atlantic DS. He served faithfully and with dedication for these years. He and Joanne have been frequently in our prayers as they face and fight the monster of cancer.

I am very proud of our DBA, under the leadership of Dr. Lyon, for their generosity in the continuation of full salary and benefits, and beyond, to Rev. LeRoy during the eight month leave of absence. Joanne's employment at the district office also continued during this time. As an end-of-service gift, the district is covering the Blue Cross plan premiums for the LeRoys during all of 2014.

David, we want to express our support and appreciation to you for your service as DS. David has requested a moment of personal privilege. As he comes forward now, please join me in expressing both appreciation for his service and commitment to our continued prayer support.

24 of our churches received new covenant members with an overall average of just over 1 per church. We received more Community Members - 72 - than Covenant Members - 68 - during the year.

2 churches updated their membership lists by removing inactive, deceased, withdrawn from the fellowship and the like and reduced their combined memberships by a total of 268. It was a move to establish an accurate and valid membership base that reflects our overall historic membership culture - that membership reflected commitment to both Christ and the local church.

28 of our churches dedicated infants during the year.

25 people declared a call to ministry or missions.

2 churches punched through the next attendance level - Saint John First - sj1 - topped 200 and Kings Valley - KV - topped 800 in average attendance.

Total building value increased by more than 4 million to 64 million +.

Total indebtedness decreased slightly by approximately 95 thousand to 14.5 million.

Total donation income increased by approximately 200 thousand to 12.8 million.

Then there were the million dollar thresholds.....

Total missions and benevolence giving increased by some 75 thousand and topped 1 million for the first time.

USF collection went just beyond 1 million - we missed it last year by 158 dollars.

Beulah and Caton's total income for the year exceeded 1 million for the first time.

Due to new construction, Caton's assets topped 1 million for the first time.

Atlantic District FY14 Year End Fiscal Overview

The overview that follows provides a snapshot of our district financial position at the end of FY14. The detailed line by line reports have been reviewed and approved by the DBA. Our fiscal statements are reviewed each year by Stevenson and Associates whose offices are in Riverview, NB.

We first introduced this summary overview style of reporting last year and it met with very positive response. Detailed copies of the financial statements are freely available to any delegate who desires a copy. However, since many have found the multi-page listing of detailed data to be too much information, unhelpful, or a bit overwhelming, we are once again utilizing a modified approach again this year.

The full multi-page report will appear in the District Journal.

A Handful of Highlights

- 1. USF collection exceeded \$1,000,000 we missed it last year by \$158.
- 2. As a result of the construction of a new washroom/chapel building on Catons Island, the fixed assets there topped \$1,000,000 for the first time.
- 3. The loan on our Moncton office building Wesleyan Place was consolidated with existing WIF loans at a reduced interest rate and significant monthly payment reduction.
- 4. The combined income for Beulah and Catons punched above \$1,000,000 for the first time with donation income at Catons reaching an all-time high of more than \$115,000.
- 5. The operating fund which includes USF, mission giving, insurance premiums and several other revenue streams is at record levels and is approaching \$2,000,000.

During the year, the fund carried the salary and benefits of two District Superintendents for eight months. At year end, 25,000 was transferred to assist in our pastors attending The Gathering this coming January and 10,000 was transferred to off set the moving costs of our incoming Assistant DS.

Our churches raised total donation income of just under 12,800,000. Of this amount, more than 713,000 was given for world wide ministry through Global Partners.

Total Operating Fund cash reserves at year end were slightly in excess of 421,000. Of this amount, some 121,000 represents restricted funds realized from the sale of property that can only be expended for real estate acquisition. An additional contingency/emergency reserve of 100,000 is also part of the above total.

Of the income received for the year, more than 78,000 represented designated donations and the remainder was transferred from reserves. These funds assisted at Sydney, funded travel to the HQ Summit held in South Carolina and covered other training events such as the Mid-Size Church Growth conference and the Hybels Leadership Summit. Total cash reserves for church planting/renewal at year end were just over 222,000. We will be reenergizing the church planting thrust of our district by new initiatives in both Maine and Newfoundland - details will be unpacked before camp concludes on Sunday night - Celebrating Tomorrow.

The year at Beulah was essentially routine from a fiscal perspective although we were advised of significant increases that will come on line this year with regards to the ongoing operation and upkeep of our wastewater system. This will necessitate an increase in lot leases for 2015 and the lot holders have been advised. Our offerings at camp meeting just missed the 50,000 mark. Total cash reserves at year end are just over 124,000 including 55,000 of restricted funds required by governmental regulations for a wastewater system maintenance reserve and a wharf maintenance grant.

Catons Island

Catons income and expenses were both at record highs last year. This was due to the major building project to construct a washroom/meeting room combination facility. Donation income reached a new level of more than 115,000, largely in support of this project. Total cash reserves at year end are a modest 6,500. Essentially all reserves were expended during the year and allocated to the construction costs of the new building on the Island.

A renovation of our office was initiated during the year that resulted in a board room being created for our use. This was accomplished by redesigning the adjacent office suite that had been vacated and capturing some of that space for our board room. This triggered a broader upgrade that led to new carpet and some new office furniture. The entire board room furniture was donated, consisting of a 12 foot board table and 12 leather chairs. Total cash reserves at the end of the year were some 29,400. These dollars will cover any remaining renovation costs in our office and assist in upgrading the two suites in the building where we have secured new tenants. All of our units are presently rented - to a barber, a hair dresser, a Christian counsellor and a nutrition therapist/consultant.

Revolving Fund

The Revolving Fund has year end assets of slightly in excess of 25,000 and it is all out on loan. These funds were utilized for ongoing costs at Shelburne Hope and will be recovered over time.

The Wesleyan Church of Canada Report

At the District Conferences in 2013 I shared a brief history on the various streams of history that have flowed together to form what is now the Atlantic and Central Canada Districts of The Wesleyan Church. In addition, the document included thoughts and projections on What Could Be; What Is; and What Is Proposed as we move toward a higher level of development and missional health for The Wesleyan Church of Canada.

The document was shared with both district conferences. Following debate and open Q and A, the conferences voted overwhelmingly (310 - 16) to approve the matter in principle and to authorize forward movement and continued concept development.

The document also outlined a proposed timetable which has been altered by unexpected circumstances. A little more than a year ago I was asked to serve the Atlantic District for an eight month period as Interim DS due to the significant health challenges facing David LeRoy. That eight months was later extended to thirteen months.

This unexpected change in circumstances resulted in an altered short-term time line going forward. It did not, however, impact the long-term view or time line projections as we move toward General Conference 2016.

Subject to Atlantic District Conference approval, I will continue to serve primarily as Atlantic DS but will give some 25% of my time and energy to TWCC for this season. This will allow for charting a forward course and for the preparation of documents for both the International Conference in 2015 and the General Conference in 2016 as well as addressing the myriad of related matters.

This year has involved working with legal counsel relative to the continuation of The Wesleyan Church of Canada under the Canada Not-for-Profit Corporations Act. The requirements for forming a Wesleyan Investment Foundation in Canada continue to be explored. Our TWCC board also underwent personnel changes this year that brought Estherlita Felecia Griffiths and Peter Moore onto the board.

The present proposed timeline is:

July 2014 - this brief update report to the two District Conferences.

Sept 2014 - two-day meeting of TWCC board to brainstorm, dream and prepare documentation for the 2015 International Conference. This will include further discussion of the big three questions - who are we; where are we going; how do we hope to get there?

Jan 2015 - present a conditional resolution to the International Conference authorizing the creation of The Wesleyan Church of Canada as an Established National Conference. This would be conditional on the approving vote of the Atlantic and Central Canada District Conferences of 2015 and ultimately the ratifying action of North American General Conference in 2016.

July 2015 - present the conditional resolution to the two district conferences for discussion, interaction and approval.

Sept 2015 - TWCC board will determine and refine the many items of implementation of the conditional resolution once ratified by the General Conference.

March 2016 - TWCC board will refine plans for any celebration of the new status that will take place at General Conference itself and the district conferences that will follow.

June 2016 - the conditional resolution will be presented to the General Conference for ratifying action.

June 2016 and following - the newly Established National Conference would take its place in the international family of our church. There will be many questions to be answered and adjustments to be made as The Wesleyan Church of Canada develops into a mature unit of the church, but it will be a great ride!
