Atlantic District of The Wesleyan Church Standing Rules

A. Principles

1. The ministers and lay persons of the Atlantic District are and shall continue to be committed to holy living and heart purity. Only those actions and attitudes that speak the mind of Christ should be evidenced among us.
2. The ministers and lay persons of the Atlantic District are and shall continue to be committed to a spirit of unity and brotherhood that, in the spirit of Christ, transcends the consideration of personal bias based on history, geography, or tradition.
3. The ministers and lay persons of the Atlantic District are and shall continue to be committed to Kingdom building through evangelism and discipleship. Our program and budgets shall reflect our high priority to winning the lost and discipling new converts.

B. District Conference Matters

For a more complete overview of the duties and powers of the district conference, please see paragraphs 1075-1180 in the *2016 Discipline of The Wesleyan Church*.

1. The Atlantic District fiscal year shall be from May 1 to April 30.
2. Local churches are encouraged to give reasonable financial assistance to their delegates and pastor when representing them at annual conference sessions.
3. District Board of Administration Members-at-Large Election

The District Board of Administration shall consist of twelve members, namely, the District Superintendent, the Assistant District Superintendent, the District Secretary, the District Treasurer and eight (8) Members-at-Large. In electing Members-at-Large, while being free to vote for any nominee, the conference delegates shall be requested to consider election so as to provide for provincial/ state representation and lay/clergy parity according to the following formula which reflects our relative strength within each geographic entity

Maine	1 lay and 1 clergy
New Brunswick	2 lay and 2 clergy
Nova Scotia/Newfoundland & Labrador/Prince Edward Island	1 lay and 1 clergy

4. District Board of Administration Staggered Terms and for Members-at-Large

All Members-at-Large shall be elected for three-year terms. Incumbents may succeed themselves at the conclusion of a three-year term if nominated and elected. Should a vacancy occur during any three-year term, such vacancy shall be filled by the DBA in accordance with existing provisions of *The Discipline*.

5. Camp Board

The Camp Board shall consist of membership both full and honorary as appointed by the DBA upon the recommendation of the District Superintendent who shall serve as Chair or appoint another to do so. The DBA shall determine the structure and scope of authority of this advisory board.

6. Officer and Department Head Elections

The District Conference shall elect only those officers and boards as required by The Discipline or the District with the District Board of Administration authorized to fill all other positions. (The District Conference will elect the District Superintendent, District Secretary, District Treasurer, District Board of Administration Members-at-Large, National Conference and General Conference delegates.)

7. Year End Fund Transfers

The strength and interdependence of our various district ministries are both recognized and celebrated. At the conclusion of each fiscal year, funds will be transferred upon the recommendation of the District Superintendent and ratified by the DBA, that will maximize our Kingdom impact as expressed in our core values and vision.

C. District Ministerial Matters

1. All ministers of the Atlantic District are expected to attend the District Conference and the Ordination Service. Satisfactory reason for any approved absence shall be provided in advance to the District Superintendent. All credentialed ministers appointed to local church service are strongly encouraged to attend Ministerial events. Lay staff in pastoral roles are also welcome to attend. Lead Pastors are expected to attend or to designate a credentialed staff member to represent the church.
2. All credentialed ministers appointed to a local church are expected to support the district camping program and to share in the work of the camp(s) as assigned. A cap of four credentialed ministers will be required per church but all will be welcome to serve at the discretion of the Lead Pastor. Satisfactory reason for any approved absence shall be provided in advance to the District Superintendent.
3. Each pastor when leaving a church, will provide for the incoming pastor a data base/information packet containing information as full and complete as possible on the pastoral charge.

D. Local Church and Pastoral Matters

For a more complete overview of pastoral responsibilities and local board of administration duties, please see paragraphs 750-782 in *The Discipline of The Wesleyan Church (2016)*.

1. Pastoral recall votes shall be routinely conducted during the first two weeks of March. The meeting for an initial pastoral call will routinely be conducted anytime after the middle of March. Any pastor wishing to announce a resignation prior to March 1 may do so only after receiving the approval of the District Superintendent
2. The tenure of an outgoing pastor shall end on the second Sunday in July and the pastoral change shall routinely take place on the following Monday.
3. Churches calling a new pastor shall pay moving expenses and related costs such as immigration expenses and travel.
4. Each pastor shall be entitled to a minimum vacation per year with pay in accordance with years of service in the ministry according to the following formula:

- 1 - 5 years service – 14 days not to exceed 2 Sundays
- 6 - 10 years service – 21 days not to exceed 3 Sundays
- 11+ years of service – 28 days not to exceed 4 Sundays

Any year of service for which a pastor is entitled to vacation is calculated from the anniversary date of the first Sunday of employment. Vacation time is fully earned upon completion of each year of service. If a pastor leaves a church prior to the anniversary date, vacation will be given on a pro-rata basis. When a pastor leaves a church at the customary time of pastoral change, the church he/she has been serving is responsible for vacation time for that conference year. No church should at any time be expected to provide vacation time in the same year for both an outgoing and incoming pastor.

5. Up to ten days including one Sunday per year are available to staff, solo and lead pastors for conference attendance, professional development, and shared ministry experience. Staff pastors must have the approval of their lead pastor and solo and lead pastors must confer with their LBA. These are to be considered minimums and may be increased by local leadership as deemed appropriate.
6. Pastors should inform the Vice-Chair of the Local Board of Administration of any plans to be absent from the pastoral charge for more than three consecutive days.
7. Sabbatical Leave:
 - a. A sabbatical leave, with pay, of up to 30 consecutive days not to include more than four Sundays, and in addition to regular vacation is available to any solo or senior pastor after completing seven years of ministry or any multiple thereof in the current place of appointment.
 - b. The specific timing of the sabbatical leave must be mutually agreed upon between the pastor and the LBA in consultation with the District Superintendent.
 - c. The church is responsible for any cost incurred in filling the pulpit during the sabbatical leave.
 - d. The pastor is responsible to spend a significant portion of the sabbatical leave involved in a learning experience either

formal or informal. The details of the learning experience component of the sabbatical leave are to be provided by the pastor to the LBA and District Superintendent when the dates of the sabbatical leave are being set.

- e. The pastor is responsible to file a report of the learning experience component of the sabbatical leave with the LBA and District Superintendent upon completion of said leave.
- f. If the learning experience component is in a formal setting, the LBA is requested to give consideration to assisting the pastor in the cost of attending such.
- g. If the learning experience component is an informal one to be pursued in a retreat setting, the Atlantic District will make accommodations at Beulah Camp available at no cost to the pastor during the sabbatical leave, subject to prior bookings.
- h. The LBA of any church having long-term staff pastors are encouraged to consider a sabbatical leave for such staff pastors in harmony with the general provisions of this resolution.

The One Hundred and Thirty-fourth Conference of the Atlantic District of The Wesleyan Church convened in the Tabernacle of Beulah Camp, Browns Flat, New Brunswick, on July 7, 2022, at 9:00 a.m.

Welcome:

District Superintendent, Rev. Peter T. Moore, extended a warm welcome to all delegates attending the 134th Atlantic District Conference. A special welcome was extended to Dr. Mark Gorveatte the District Superintendent of the Crossroads District.

Atlantic District Superintendent Report

July 7, 2022 – District Conference

February 15th was the fifth anniversary of my Dad's passing. I was blessed with a present and loving father during my formative years. He was a teacher turned preacher and he taught my brother & I many things about many things. When tough times came my Dad used to say a very daddish thing, "Son, keep your chins up!" Which I thought was really funny until one day I looked in the mirror and saw more than one chin. Keep your chins up. Real funny, Dad.

Some of the warmest memories I have in my childhood were spent playing chess with my father. On occasion to help me explore different strategies, we would start the game without our most powerful piece – the Queen. That piece can do pretty much everything any other piece can do except the Knight. And I can assure you, *playing Queen-less* is a very different game that leaves you feeling helpless until you can figure out new ways to win.

Ed Stetzer said that leading churches through the pandemic was a lot like playing chess without the Queen. What is our Queen in Kingdom leadership? It's the ability to gather our people. The restrictions and fears and polarization around gathering our church families made the last two years of local church ministry a very different game than any of us could have predicted and certainly a very different Queen-less game than any of us ever signed up to play.

Leading in the Kingdom is challenging in the best of times. As we gather this week for the first time in 2.5 years since our District Ministerial in January of 2020, we will not serve ourselves well to rush past the intense impact of this season. The extended uncertainty of leading in less-than-the-best of times has left our souls threadbare – often in the extreme. We have felt new depths of anxiety about the expectations of those we serve. The measures and methods we have found to be effective were – for the most part – no longer available in the arsenal of how we advance mission. The options we have had were constantly changing and often confusing at best. And the hamster wheel of this context sapped our motivation and left us feeling numb on more days than we would ever care to admit.

We are grieving the loss of what was. And whatever new thing God will help us build, the best of what we had before is not coming back in the same way. And while some churches in our tribe are just beginning to experience what looks like a new day – there are not any who would confidently declare they have recovered or discovered a new way. The sadness of this season of setbacks has eclipsed our souls on any given week. Many of us have experienced new depths of lament in our calling as we seek to abide in The Vine. We have been disillusioned and discouraged by circumstances beyond our control. And like Christ in Gethsemane, we have often been disappointed by people we have faithfully served who seem to have abandoned us in our hour of need.

And occasionally someone else we know has had a win in their church – and while we have truly celebrated with them on one level, on another level we have secretly battled with the comparison game that is birthed out of a spirit of envy on our worst days. And some of those days, we have privately wondered about the relevance of our impact and what difference it would actually make if we chose to do something else.

The conversations I have had with many of you over the past year have had a similar theme – the challenges of leading in the fall of 2021 felt ten times heavier than they did in 2020. And if we're honest with ourselves, even as restrictions began to lift this spring, the mixed bag in the levels of re-engagement by our people has added to our discouragement and doubt about the future impact of our churches.

Please hear this next statement from my heart: You're not wrong and you're certainly not weak for feeling any – or even all – of these things.

Even pre-pandemic, Church Vitalization Canada released a report showing that 80% of churches in our country have been in decline over the past four decades. According to another 2019 CBC report, it is estimated that by 2030 a third of all religious spaces of worship across Canada (9,000 buildings!) will be closed, the vast majority of which are Christian churches. According to a mid-pandemic national study in 2021 almost 40% of pastors have considered quitting the ministry.

And birthed out of the pain-filled reality of the increasing secularization of our society and the Queen-less chess game of pandemic ministry, our 2021 Atlantic District Vision Team sensed the Lord giving us a word for 2022. Renewal. Renewal for our souls as Undershepherds and renewal for our churches. Not a pull-up-ourselves by our bootstraps, stiff-upper-lip, white-knuckle-it kind of self-help. But a renewal that leads us to the throne of the One who has called us to lead this Great Commission. A renewal that leads us by the still waters of deep transformation that can only come to Kingdom servants by His Spirit. A renewal that throws our souls on the mercy seat of God Most High and trusts Him to do the work we cannot do to bring healing and hope.

And so, wherever you are this morning in your own experience of renewal – hear this, we've got to get this right because your soul matters too. You are part of the mission we share – and not just because of what you do for the Church you lead.

Throughout 2021, our Atlantic District Vision Team met for seven days over several months to seek God for direction. And we had many breakthrough moments of clarity. This excellent work was a direct outcome of the report by the DBA-appointed Task Force resulting from the action of District Conference in 2019. This October, I will be conducting Roundtables across the district for our pastors to share in more detail these insights and our forward plan for renewal in our churches in the emerging landscape of post-pandemic ministry.

To begin our 2022 journey of renewal this winter, pastors received a copy of Pete Scazzero's book, *Emotionally Healthy Leaders*. Resources were provided for each of you to engage in a personal retreat to develop what Scazzero calls a *Rule of Life*. Special thanks to David Zigler and AJ Plaizier for their good work this February in priming the pump for each of us to personally engage Scazzero's work. Many of you took advantage of the opportunity to share this journey along with those in your Pastor Cluster. Here's what we know - before we can ever triage the health of our churches, we must do the work to triage the health of our souls.

Our mission has never been more clear:
Unleashing Churches for Transformed Lives!

And the core vision for this mission over the next five years is this:

- By 2027, we will raise and release a core of 400 church leaders who are equipped and effective in leading healthy churches that are cooperating and multiplying around the district and in the world.

You may have noticed our core values no longer hang around this Tabernacle. These were refined from six to four by the Atlantic District Vision Team and will also be fully introduced in October and reintroduced at Beulah Camp next summer. However, today I want you to hear our first core value – here it is:

We are a people Anchored in Holiness: We are committed to Holy Scripture and surrendered to a Holy God.

This is who we are, and it is demonstrated by...

- Shaping our priorities by God's unchanging Word
- Submitting to Scripture in all stances, policies, and practices
- Prioritizing personal encounters with a Holy God
- Proclaiming the hope of holiness in our gatherings
- Evidencing the fruit of the Spirit in our congregations and leaders

This core value finds Scriptural Support in Leviticus 19:2 & Romans 12:1-2.

As we step out of the fog and pull out of the quicksand of this pandemic season, we step firmly onto the spiritual foundation of our humble beginnings. We are a people called out to be Anchored in Holiness.

Each Delegate received a complimentary copy of Rev. Dan LeRoy's recent book, *Reclaiming Our Holiness Heritage: The Battle for the Heart, Soul, Mind and Future of The Wesleyan Church*. I trust the time you spend reading this will renew your desire to see the mighty work of the Holy Spirit unleashing new ways and new days for the hope and holiness of Jesus.

And to underscore this bedrock value of our tribe, we have none other than Dr. Steve DeNeff here to preach in this morning's service on holiness. We are blessed by his willingness to be here with us once again as our Camp Evangelist after about 15 years. Dr. DeNeff is unsurpassed as a Kingdom leader in The Wesleyan Church who both practices and preaches the unchanging truth about Scriptural holiness. And later this morning, he will be opening The Word of God to deliver a powerful message about our preeminent core value – that we are a people Anchored in Holiness.

As we reconfigured our core values there are three more that will be unpacked in more detail this fall when we meet, but for now I will share them in brief. The Atlantic District is and aspires to be Anchored in Holiness, Partnered in Mission, Effective in Context, & Courageous in Action.

Much more to come at our October Roundtables as we will also introduce a tool to serve the self-assessment of your church for renewal. We will also share with one another what we are discovering about the elusive scorecard for effective post-pandemic ministry.

And although we are just emerging from the desert of this pandemic context, we have Holy Spirit transformation to celebrate today. And we need to celebrate – you have heard me say it before and you'll hear me say it again. Every number has a name, and every name has a story that matters for eternity. Are you ready for some good news? **Since we last gathered in 2019, we have celebrated 840 baptisms and 1,444 salvations!**

Here are some more numbers. 2020 reporting for primary worship attendance average did not include March or April numbers which are typically some of the strongest weeks of the year during Lent & Easter. And yet, this statistical anomaly still yielded the highest in-person attendance ever in the Atlantic District of 9,432. By the end of FY 2021 that number had dropped to nearly half 4,821 – a decline of 49%. This past year just ended – in-person attendance rose to 6,084. While that is a one-year increase of 25%, it is still shy of two-thirds of our 2020 high-water mark.

Online engagement has been the wild frontier of pandemic ministry. Every church became multi-site within weeks of the pandemic with an online campus. In 2019, we reported online connection for primary worship with a weekly average of 653 viewers. Two years later we reported 6,415 – nearly ten times more. We are all trying to figure out the best way to determine virtual baselines for how we should count, but more importantly how we can meaningfully engage these viewers in an effective Discipleship Pathway.

Financial highlights will be mentioned in the District Treasurer's Report later this morning but suffice it say that overall, the worst-case doom and gloom predictions at the beginning of the pandemic did not prove to be accurate. The faithfulness and effectiveness of our pastors and boards to steward what the Lord provided through the generosity of His people, resulted in nearly every church ending each

pandemic year in black ink.

I would be remiss in not expressing personal gratitude for a few of you who serve in the inner circle of district leadership. Karrilee, you continue unequalled as the secret sauce of the Atlantic District. Tami, your addition to the senior leadership team as Executive Director in the early months of the pandemic has been an immeasurable gift in so many ways. You are growing into your engagement with local churches in modelling the importance of lay leadership alongside clergy. Your stellar executive coaching skills so effectively serve the leadership team of our District Camp Ministry. We could not have been better led in this area during this pandemic season. Scott Prime, as our Asst. DS, you are a well-spring of wisdom and unwavering belief in the Church. Your insights, maturity, and love for Kingdom servants are of the highest order. And I thank God for giving me Ellen – who is wise and strong. She loves the Church, but she loves me more. God has used her example to teach me how to reciprocate the priority that family is first ministry.

My father used to be in tribal meetings like these as one of our Kingdom colleagues. Some of you here today don't even know his name. And a day is coming when all of us will be where my Dad now is – that great cloud of witnesses. And some who were still with us when we last gathered 2.5 years ago at the District Ministerial have been called home and have joined my father in that cloud. Would you stand with me as we remember these great men and women of the faith?

Rev. Milton Bagley, Mrs. Pat Briggs, Mrs. Jean Brown, Dr. Bill Burbury, Mrs. Ethel Cameron, Mrs. Gerrie denHollander, Mrs. Helene Gorman, Rev. Les Hicks, Mrs. Janet Ingersoll, Mrs. Kay Ingersoll, Rev. Jack MacKenzie, Mrs. Kay Morehouse, Mrs. Margo Perry, and Mrs. Gloria Wilson.

Gloria's service yesterday was the first in-person gathering of all our pastors since Ministerial in January 2020. An unimaginable break in the established rhythms of our face-to-face connection. And I know she would be pleased that her celebration day was a heartfelt and timely reminder of the eternal hope we share in our commitment to His Cause. Before we are seated, let us honour these choice servants with bowed heads and a moment of silent gratitude for their influence. (*Moment of Silence*) You may be seated.

Others will follow us, and while they may not even remember our names, they will stand upon our shoulders just like we stand on those of our spiritual parents in the Lord's work. God help us if our pride never succeeds in convincing us that we are here because of the greatness of our own personal story. We are here because we are an integral part of His. And whether the part we play may be viewed by others as great or small, it is only His glory that matters in the end.

Jeff Patterson gives us the gift of remembering how God can use this pandemic for his glory. "God (Patterson declares) is the great vinedresser who does what is necessary for the fruitfulness of the garden. God does not always prune in ways

that are understood or controlled by the wishes of humans. God's work of tending the garden for the purposes of renewal is hard to control, ...chaotic, and messy. Since creation, our gracious God has been doing this work of birthing new life in the church. Pruning to bring about greater fruit (Patterson concludes) is part of God's ongoing work in the Church."

Darren Harrison will never forget the events of May 10, 2022. The unthinkable happened when he found himself at the helm of a single-engine Cessna 208. It was flying back from the Bahamas to Florida and the pilot was incapacitated by a catastrophic cardiac event. Air Traffic Controller Robert Morgan was on flight deck duty and just happened to be a certified flight instructor. Miraculously, Robert was able to talk Darren – a random passenger who had never flown a plane – through to a safe landing. It not only spared Darren's life so he could be reunited with his expecting wife, but the pilot was able to receive lifesaving medical treatment.

Ladies and gentlemen – my trusted Kingdom colleagues – if you are in this room today, by God's grace you have landed a plane that no one could have prepared you to fly. This two-year global pandemic put us all as pastors and lay leaders at the helm of what felt like an impossible situation. And there have been some casualties. Loved ones who lost their lives or livelihoods because of the coronavirus and those who felt they needed to step aside from Kingdom leadership. But we are here today because Christ, the Head of the Church, has guided us by His Spirit through to a safe landing.

Friends, we are not victims of our circumstance. We are stewards of our response. Jesus said, "I have brought you glory on earth by completing the work you gave me to do." God has found you worthy to be a steward of Kingdom leadership and He has sustained you. Now is the time for RENEWAL. So, for God's sake and for His glory - keep your chins up!

Atlantic District Executive Director Report

The 2021 camping ministry season was a testimony to God's faithfulness and the dedication of our Tribe to gather in His name.

Beulah Camp and Conference Center (BCCC) experienced a significant increase in use of properties by leaseholders and guests throughout the Summer@Beulah 2021 season. A full schedule of activities and events were enjoyed throughout July and August along with record attendance of summer Sunday services in the Tabernacle. Thanks to the engagement of dedicated staff, committed volunteers, and generous donors, new highlights of the 2021 summer season included a Saturday evening concert series on the patio known as the BAC-Yard outside the Beulah Activity Centre, prayer walks, disc-golf, ice-cream truck, and Beulah's Got Talent. BCCC also received favorable participatory response to winter events including fireworks and fun on the February provincial Family Day holiday, in addition to skating on the Lake of Galilee. Cottage sales, seasonal trailer lot requests, permanent residence development, leaseholder rentals, and the four season use of BCCC lodging facilities increased significantly throughout the pandemic seasons of 2020-2021. This expanded use of BCCC as a year round facility has opened doors for increased ministry potential while also highlighting our need for longer term planning for infrastructure and property development. My warmest thanks to the capable and highly effective Board members who support the mission of Beulah through Spirit-filled vision and skilled action.

Caton's Island also experienced a much stronger than expected pandemic 2021 season with 9 weeks of camps supported by 39 paid staff and 15 full-time volunteers. Approximately 1200 campers were influenced by the Gospel, with reports of 130 salvations and 98 recommitments, along with zero campers or staff testing positive for COVID-19 while on the island! With much gratitude, the Caton's Island team honoured Assistant Director Ian MacMath for 10 years of excellent service and welcomed long time staff member Amy Vail as the Assistant Director for the 2022 camping season. The restaurant quality food-service improvements to the Choate Dining Hall are slated for completion in summer 2022, creating the ability to efficiently provide 250 meals over a 30 minute period, in multiple rotations 3 times a day. Special thanks to Board member Greg Walton for his professional contribution to the leadership and success of this project. Along with Rev. Brian Murray as project point, the partnership with Director Dean Stephenson and the Caton's Island Board has been one of excellence and Kingdom effectiveness. As societal needs increase, the ministry of Caton's Island to children and teens is not only critical but life-saving. I challenge us to continue to lean in to supporting this ministry prayerfully, through practical service, and with your financial gifts. Now more than ever, our children need relationship with Jesus and the tools of discipleship that will provide them with lifelong foundations.

In addition to overseeing camping ministry, I have had the privilege of serving on the DBMD executive, participating in the Kingdom Force Executive Leadership

Institute of The Wesleyan Church, consulting with ministry and lay leaders, and supporting the district's multiplication discipleship pathway process with 11 lay and clergy leadership teams. As a disciple who makes disciples who then make disciples, it is my call to support laity within the Atlantic District in forming reciprocal partnerships with clergy to function as the CLAY that embody the foundation of Kingdom influence and discipleship. As a lay person, it is with a heart of gratefulness that I am privileged to serve the Atlantic District.

Riverside Camp Director Report

Riverside 2021 was our first camp since 2019 and was a challenge in Maine because of changing restrictions. We decided to go with a day camp format and then, once again, state requirements changed again, this time to the good of camping. We quickly decided to go with an overnight format, running a shorter 4-day children's camp and a combined Sr-Jr high camp. It required a huge effort from volunteers as several renovations had to be undertaken including significant projects on our hotel/girl's dorm/dining hall building.

Riverside, like Caton's, is so dependent on the faithfulness of volunteers to keep our grounds and buildings in quality shape and last year, coming out of COVID, we are thankful for the many who stepped forward. I personally want to thank our camp directors who shouldered extra responsibility as I underwent a double knee replacement one week prior to camp startup. The challenge was to find counsellors as the colleges were not available but as always God has a way of providing for Riverside.

What was remarkable once again was the unique way the Holy Spirit visited our services. One little girl from children's camp shared with her grandfather about a service where the campers just began to weep. She said, "I just started crying and I did not know why but I knew it was from God." Her grandfather assured her it was the Holy Spirit and she said, "That was what it was." That service saw children praying over their friends and God witnessing to them that they were important in His Kingdom. Jesus made real to them His words spoken to His disciples, "Suffer the little children to come unto Me and forbid them not. For of such is the kingdom of God." Fifty-two campers experienced Jesus as a real and living presence in their lives.

Sr/Jr High camp saw 54 campers and again God was present. There were the typical times of God visiting services in unique ways as well as a great sense camaraderie so typical of Riverside kids. That sense of togetherness reflects in the "connection" these same kids have with other campers when they attend events

such as Encounter at Kingswood and One Conference. Camp ended with a total of 13 kids discovering a personal relationship with Jesus and being baptized Friday evening.

God had other plans and I found myself once again in the chair position. I was quickly reminded that there is a uniqueness to Riverside that can only be described as God's anointing.

Every year there are movements of God on kids that are so powerful and life changing that is reflected in lifelong service in The Wesleyan Church. Many who lead our churches today claim Riverside as the place they became fully committed to serving God for a lifetime. It has been a privilege to serve.

2022 Atlantic District Fiscal Year-End Overview

We praise God for His provision during this two-year pandemic. While the ability to gather has been deeply disrupted, the commitment to give financially has continued – for the most part – in the worship of our people above and beyond what any of us would have predicted. And we have been careful stewards of the provision of God’s people. A few – just a few – of our churches have struggled with significant financial downturns. However, most of our churches experienced a net positive in revenue over expense during both pandemic years, and in several cases saw an increase over pre-pandemic levels - to God be the glory!

The overview that follows provides a snapshot of our district financial position at the end of FY2022. Detailed copies of the financial statements are available at the district office for any delegate upon request. Our 2022 year-end fiscal statements have been reviewed by Ascend Chartered Professional Accountants of Sussex, NB, and have subsequently approved by the DBA when it convened earlier this week. The full report of our financial statements will appear in the District Journal published on or before August 31st.

Here are a few *Noteworthy Highlights* from FY 2022:

1. Over this past year, more than \$110,000 was invested directly from district operations in Kingdom multiplication efforts which will be highlighted this afternoon. This was in addition to more than \$100,000 invested in FY 2021.
2. Our USF collection rate reached an historic high this year – 99%! Every single church participated in meeting this obligation and all but five churches gave 100% or more. A special mention goes to three of our first-time lead pastors who had reached 100% USF by the end of January with three months to go – Tim Conrad (Woods Harbour), John Lamos (Lighthouse – Grand Manan, & Luc Reed – Crystal; WELL DONE gentlemen! We are blessed with Kingdom leaders who can be trusted to honour their commitments. This highest-ever level of response is deeply appreciated and makes an enormous difference in the district’s capacity to serve our churches and pastors.
3. The flow of funds through the district office during the year for all purposes exceeded \$3.9M. It should also be noted that the USF for FY2023 included in the District Conference represents a decrease of nearly \$57K distributed among churches with assessable income exceeding a half million dollars. This is a continued result of the action of the 2017 District Conference to lower the district assessment rate beyond denominational guidelines by an additional 1% between \$500K and \$1M and 2% above 1\$M.
4. The pandemic impacted the rental continuity of Wesleyan Place, our District Office in Moncton, which resulted in the replacement of two tenants. Even during the pandemic with significant loss of income the net cost to the district for this excellent facility was only \$800 per month.
5. Beulah and Caton’s Island had a combined income just shy of \$1.5M and the district operating fund processed nearly \$2.5M.

6. Caton’s Island is nearing completion of an \$800K expansion to the Choate Dining Hall. The new world-class facility will be able to feed 425 people per meal and eliminates the pressures of growth that have been a great challenge in recent years. You will not want to miss the Caton’s Open House this Saturday to see it yourself first-hand. The Choate Dining Hall Expansion will be fully operational in the coming weeks and has been generously supported by key donors so that Caton’s Island can remain debt free.
7. Total district giving to Global Partners was over \$256K. This investment represents partnership with 21 projects and 27 missionaries in 22 countries. Would the pastors and delegates of these top five churches listed in the order of total dollars given please stand – this year they were Moncton, Cornerstone, Yarmouth, Woodstock, & Framework. In addition to these leaders, would the pastors of the top five per capita giving to Global Partners please stand? Cornerstone (the only church on both lists), Trinity, Corbett, Crystal, & Browns Flat Fellowship. (Let’s show our appreciation for their leadership!)
8. The National Blue Cross Plan has only required one modest premium increase over the past decade (since 2012) which occurred in 2019. In addition to containing this cost for our churches to serve our employees, there remains a healthy district reserve to address future health care exigencies as may be needed for our pastoral families.
9. The WIF loan contains residue balances of \$1.15M from several projects including Heritage Hall, Centennial Park, River Haven, Wesleyan Place and the Tabernacle expansion. However, by far the largest component in this balance is the funding of the state-of-the-art wastewater system which allows for continued growth in Beulah Camp and Conference Center operations.

The year-end fiscal position of the Atlantic District continues to be a stable foundation for our immediate future as we seek God for wisdom to invest these resources in our shared mission to transform lives, communities, and churches through the hope and holiness of Jesus Christ!
